



Baptism is a special, public, outward act done to picture what God has done inside of us when we are saved. IT DOES NOT SAVE US. It allows us to tell others that we believe in Jesus and what he has done for us in his death. It lets us show others our commitment to follow Jesus. Four main things that baptism visibly demonstrates include: 1) Repentance, 2) Burial with Christ (union with Christ in his death), 3) Resurrection with Christ (union with Christ in his resurrection), and 4) Adoption into the Body of Christ.

## Instructions

As part of the baptism process at PCC, we ask for you to complete the following preparation worksheet so that you can discuss it with a mentor (a pastor or ministry leader) prior to baptism. If you are a parent inquiring for your child, please notify the office at least one month in advance in order to permit the mentor sufficient time to walk with your child through the meaning and significance of this important event in their lives. Baptisms are conducted publicly by PCC pastors in the fall and winter during Sunday morning worship services and in the summer during Sunday evening picnics.
